


Join Ally McKinley at her cosy little guesthouse in the Scottish Highlands for whisky by the fire, beautiful mountain views and... a murder to solve?






When the murderer strikes again, Augusta and Philip are forced to rethink their investigation


Can Tommy & Evelyn beat the ticking clock of Mother Nature and uncover the vile perpetrator before their child makes its long-awaited appearance?




Meet DCI Lesley Clarke. She's a straighttalking city copper who doesn't suffer fools gladly... and she's been transferred to rural Dorset.

But things don't stay calm for long.


Before she's even started her new job, Lesley is dragged into investigating a murder at one of England's most iconic landmarks, the imposing Corfe Castle.

Marooned after a garden party turns sinister, Lady Ellen finds herself in the midst of an unsettling mystery.



Then a second villager is found dead. Can the three Blix women find the killer and return the community to safety?




Life's a struggle for Rosemary Thorn and her teen daughter, Athena. But their regular troubles are turned upside down after Granny Thorn's mysterious death.



A small town with endless secrets, strange activities, and a house with a mind of its own.





Reverend Alina Merrycott returns in a new story when her friend, the author Lucinda Elmhurst comes to stay.



But then a complication arises when Lord Marlowe insists on assisting with the enquiry. The forced proximity to the earl may very well derail the investigation.




Isabelle Darby has escaped a disastrous marriage by moving to the picturesque Cotswold village of Lower Dimblebrook.







The Supermarket Sleuths are on the case — and hopefully they'll find the missing carpet before the royals arrive!




Murder stalks the cobbles in England's finest Georgian town...

Soon, Felicia is swept into a mystery that has everyone in the community as a potential suspect—including her.


As the body count rises and with the people she loves under threat, Felicia takes matters into her own hands. But even the most picturesque place has its secrets...



Who killed the Mayor? It's up to the Marlow Murder Club to find out . . .


